Matters Arising

Escrick Landfill Site. Uk Waste Management Ltd have advised that any plans for waste disposal have been mothballed for the time-being, (planning permission has been granted). Its status is being reviewed and the Parish Council will be notified when the site is to re-open although this is not envisaged during the current year.

Temporary Closure of the Escrick to Wheldrake Road. This will now take effect during the period 17 July - 28 July inclusive.

Hollicarrs sign Halcrow advise that they are giving further consideration as to the possibility of relocating the sign.

Dog fouling As it is difficult to enforce a ban the Chairman will order seven signs at a cost of £10 each with the wording "Please do not exercise your dog on the village green" There will be an extra cost for the the mounting of these. Mr Wilson will also place a notice in the Parish magazine.

Waste bins The broken bins have now been replaced.

Noticeboard sign Mr Wilson has now purchased a sign at a cost of £36.99.

Street Lighting Mr Brooksbank will be fitting the CDM light by the monument in the very near future.

Abattoir Mr Forbes Adam reported that the smell was an on-going problem. The Environmental Health People had agreed there is some cause for concern.

North Selby Mine Selby District Council is not raising any opposition to the North Selby Mine being made into an industrial site. Mr Wilson reported that York City Council has been asked to delay the decision until the green belt problem has been resolved. Details of new mining has been sent to some householders in the village.

SDC – Flyposting SDC has received a number of complaints regarding an increasing incidence of flyposting within the District. They advise that this form of advertising is illegal and leaflets should be displayed within local shop windows, newspapers or village newsletters etc.

SDC – Housing Officers. Notification has been received of new officers and their areas of responsibility.

SDC – Housing Grants Grants are currently available from the Housing Grants team at SDC. Further information from the Environmental Health Dept. A poster to be placed on the Parish Noticeboard.

Main Street. Confirmation of funding has been received for the proposed works on Main Street which are likely to begin in the Autumn. NYCC have confirmed that they look forward to receipt of the £1000 offered by EPC towards the work, and will request this amount in due course.

Mr Russell reported that SDC have in the past written requesting details of our neighbourhood watch scheme. However, they have now appointed a Neighbourhood Watch Officer. Escrick will continue with our own newsletter which Mrs Horne volunteered to help distribute in the Carr Lane area. Mr Forbes Adam reported that the Ouse and Derwent Watch has a system whereby they pass on information to farmers and other members of the organisation.

Mrs Horne reported that the tenancy of the two police houses (which were taken over by York Housing Association) is coming to an end. Clerk to write to York Housing with a request to be kept informed of any future redevelopment.

Clerk to write to the Drainage Board requesting that the grass be cut by the dyke in Carr Lane.

NYCC – Escrick Park Estate – Bye-ways and rights of way

The Chairman produced a copy of a statement and plan for the above property which has been received from NYCC Milestones Rights of Way Officer. Mr Wilson reported that the copy of the rights of way is as per the definitive map. Mr Forbes Adam stated that he is concerned over increased security risks and Mr Hulley reported that this is also the concern of the school. Mr Forbes Adam left the meeting and discussion took place as to the Council's way forward. It was decided that Mr Wilson should invite Mr David Nunns (representative from the Footpaths Association) and Mr David Blenkinsop (County Hall) to our next meeting. Mr Wilson will discuss the matter further with Mr Forbes Adam.

Matters Arising:

Police houses, Carr Lane. The cost of the land is rumoured to be £360,000. The Chairman will write to the North Yorkshire Police expressing the Parish Council's concern about the proposed development of the site and the possibility that the two existing houses may be demolished.

Overhanging trees, Parsonage Hotel. The Parsonage Hotel have written to confirm that they have taken steps to have the overhanging trees pruned and hope that this work will be carried out in the very near future.

Grass verges A19. Halcrow have written to confirm that they hope to repair the damaged verges within two months of their letter (30/08/00).


Sub-station, Skipwith Road. Northern Electric have written to say they have the grass cutting of the surrounding area in hand.

North Selby Mine. Mr Wilson showed Parish Councillors a copy of an article which had been sent to him by Mr Maurice Vassie, Deighton PC. It was felt that the Parish Council are doing all they can to prevent this land being redeveloped for industrial use.

Escrick Park Estate. Mr Forbes Adam explained the reasons why he has felt it necessary to tighten up on members of the public entering Escrick Park. He emphasised that in no way does he wish to bar long-standing residents of Escrick from enjoying the pleasure of walking through the Park, nor does he wish to create conflict. He does, however, have to protect the estate and he wishes to avoid the situation where just anybody feels they have the right to access. Discussion followed as to how this course of action could be effectively carried out and a register of names or a card system were suggested. Mr Forbes Adam will consider the issuing of cards, but also reiterated that villagers were welcome to walk in the grounds provided they have first obtained permission from the Estate Office. Mr Forbes Adam also said he was considering extending the footpath from Gassy Wood to the cricket pavillion. Mr Wilson and Mr Forbes Adam to continue to liaise on the matter.

The grass opposite 41 - 47 Carrs Meadow has been cut. Mr Forbes Adam to look into the possibility of this being cut on a regular basis.

Mr Forster asked about newspaper recycling. Mrs Casling reported that at the moment funding is not available. A paperbank is currently situated in the primary school grounds. Money is available for a bottle bank however and Mrs Casling will endeavour to obtain further information although the siting could be a problem.

MATTERS ARISING

Police Houses, Carr Lane. There is uncertainty as to how the site will be developed. Councillor Ashton is to try and find out what the land and property has been sold for.

Halcrow UK

Bottle Bank - The Highways Agency will not accept the siting of a bottle bank in the lay by south of Escrick. Mrs Casling reported that there is a time restriction to our acceptance of the bank. The Escrick and Deighton Club are agreeable to it being sited there, however as it is Estate land Mr Forbes Adam would have to give his approval. Consideration would also have to be given to the residents of the Glade and if we go ahead then it should be on a trial basis only and the residents of The Glade would be informed accordingly.

Hollicarrs

Halcrow will look into the feasibility of a lamp being erected at the bus stop. It is not normal practice for the Highways Agency to fund such a lamp, however, the Parish may be able to apply to erect a lamp at their own expense which we understand would cost in the region of £1000.

Flooding - Scorce Bridge


The old A19 at Scorce Bridge is the responsibility of NYCC. Mr Wilson has visited the site on a few occasions during heavy rain and feels that at the moment we are unable to make a substantiated request for the problem to be rectified.

Halcrow are to measure the central refuge to check compliance with current regulation and if necessary will take action. Mr Wilson has spoken to Councillor David Ashton about the problem.

Emergency Committee

Mr Russell has obtained all relevant papers from Mrs Calvert. These are to be circulated and an Emergency Officer will be appointed in due course.

Parish Requirements 2001/02

After taking into account our anticipated expenditure for the coming financial year the Parish Precept was set at £8000 and Selby District Council is to be notified accordingly. Proposed by Mr B Forster, seconded by Mr M Russell. However, SDC have advised that we have 442 band D properties in the village whereas the Parish Council are of the opinion that we have 353. Mr Wilson to query the discrepancy.

It was agreed that for the 2001/2002 financial year Mr Ron Watson's payment for cleaning the bus shelter would be increased to £160.

The Carr Lane end of Main Street has now been resurfaced.

It was reported that the lighting at the Skipwith Road with the A19 junction is poor. A request is to be made to the District Council requesting that a footpath be erected in Carr Lane from Main Street to the junction of the A19.
